

From January 26 to February 1, 2020, 9 students and 3 teachers from I Liceum Ogólnokształcące in Katowice, Poland involved in the project "Website for the Exchange of Bilingual Schools", took part in the last meeting of participants from all partner schools from Spain, Germany, Poland and The Netherlands. This time the host was the Dutch school Bisschop College Broekhin in Roermond, Limburg. The purpose of the meeting was primarily to learn about bilingual education in the Netherlands and to summarize two years of cooperation.

On the first day of our stay, we took part in classes conducted in international groups. Their main topic was learning about cultural stereotypes that we have about various countries. We all, both students and teachers liked that activity very much.

In the afternoon we participated in the field game, thank to which we discovered the city of our hosts from a different perspective that a regular tourist.

The next day was devoted to classes in Maastricht and the surrounding area. We visited a complex of limestone caves used during the Second World War as a shelter for the city's inhabitants. In the afternoon we had the

opportunity to get to know the city and its history by visiting it in small groups guided by local guides. On the basis of the information obtained, we then solved a knowledge quiz about Maastricht.



Wednesday - the third day of stay - allowed us to learn how to teach bilingual at a Dutch school. Students and teachers participated in classes of Spanish, geography, art, biology, economics, physics, mathematics. All lessons were conducted in English.

The next day's work in Dutch Roermond required a lot of creativity from the participants of the Webs project. Their task was to make music videos for selected songs in English and Dutch in the form of lipdub. Under the direction of two producers, they managed to create small

masterpieces of film art. Making music videos for the songs: "Single Ladies" and "Ikstajoubeter" required a lot of communication skills but it gave everyone a lot of fun.

The last day of our Dutch adventure we summarized the activities of an international group of students. We watched photos taken together, films and artistic performances. We tried dishes made by students and brought to school.

Of course, apart from the official activities, we had plenty of opportunities to get to know each other better and broaden our knowledge of English.
